

Salmon-friendly culverts
help salmon get where they
need to be.



The Conservation District is seeking grant funding to replace these culverts beneath Barnum Point Road on Kristoferson Creek, with a larger, fish-friendly culvert.

Project Proposal Snapshot:

- Right now, Kristoferson Creek flows under Barnum Point Road through four concrete pipes that lay side-by-side. These pipes are too small for salmon trying to swim upstream into Kristoferson Creek from Triangle Cove (see front photo).
- Young Chinook salmon and steelhead (from the Skagit and Stillaguamish Rivers) use Kristoferson Creek for several months before they migrate out to the ocean.
- Kristoferson Creek is also used by chum and coho for spawning - the new culvert would improve passage for these species as well.
- The project would not result in additional fees for residents and would be funded entirely through grants.
- Proposed Project Timeline: January 1st, 2015–December 31st, 2016
