Project Description

Bainbridge Island Land Trust will complete a preliminary design to restore 575 lineal feet of shoreline more than 2 acres of tidelands and over 8 acres of associated riparian habitat along Port Orchard Passage, on the SW shore of Bainbridge Island. The design will address removing bulkheads, intertidal fill, house(s), and associated infrastructure. The design will address shoreline processes, cultural resources, geotechnical analysis, hydrology, and vegetation. Examination of best course of action to remove/demolish structures on the property will occur. Cost estimates and initial permitting work will be completed. This project is Phase I of a multi-phased project. Phase II will be land acquisition and Phase III will complete final design and restore the site. The Trust for Public Land and Bainbridge Island Land Trust are pursuing a purchase of these properties for future habitat, open space and public access use, and to restore a segment of the shoreline, which, when combined with other non-developed shoreline in this reach of Port Orchard Pass, would result in more than one half mile of contiguous unarmored shoreline. Upon completion of this project, the Land Trust will seek funding for Phase II and Phase III.

Worksite Description: The project site is approximately 11.11 acres encompassing multiple parcels (8 in whole or in part) owned by two different parties. A design plan for restoring the shoreline and associated riparian areas will be conducted.

Site Access Directions: Landowner permission needed prior to access via project sponsor. From Poulsbo, take Highway 305 10.5 miles east then south onto Bainbridge Island. Turn right at the intersection of HWY 305 and Miller Road. Follow Miller Road until a four way stop at the corner of Miller and New Brooklyn/Fletcher Bay Roads. Turn right onto Fletcher Bay Road. Once you cross Springbrook Creek, take a left onto Springridge Road. Follow road to the top of the hill. Gated driveway will be on the right hand side.
