The proposed fee-simple acquisition will permanently conserve about 25 acres of floodplain habitat at River Mile 9 of the Dungeness River near Sequim, WA. In addition, floodplain restoration work will include revegetating about 3 acres, removing about 500 ft of riprap armoring, and reconnecting historical side channel habitats. The proposed project will benefit listed chinook salmon, bull trout, summer chum, and steelhead, as well as other salmon species.

The proposed Robinson acquisition has the potential to restore natural channel processes along a priority reach of the lower Dungeness River. Three houses will need to be removed from the associated parcels. For any rental properties, the project sponsor will need to determine potential relocation costs for each tenant and include them in the project budget.

The Robinson parcels would be an excellent acquisition to help protect threatened salmon and steelhead in the Dungeness River. Hopefully, the proposed project will lead to an opportunity to purchase the last developed parcel north of Otter Road and allow for the removal of all infrastructure from the floodplain area.

#### **4. Staff Comments:**

Staff has discussed on the phone with the sponsor that in order to be eligible as a reach-scale/multi-site acquisition project the sponsor must comply with the eligibility criteria found in Manual 18, Section 2 Eligibility, under Acquisition. Another alternative is to instead focus the application on the Robinson and Smith parcels off of Otter Road, instead of a more open, reach-scale project.
